

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The small stone house at **13 Bailey Road** is located very close to the street edge at both Bailey and Fiske Roads. A white picket fence delineates the yard. The one by four bay, two-and-a-half story rests on a granite foundation. A rear ell clad in vinyl siding projects from the south (rear) façade of the rectangular building and rests on a granite foundation. A smaller one-and-a-half story ell projects from the west side of the stone house. The stone work of the house features large quoin stones, smaller stones near the eaves, and large granite lintels. The main entrance is recessed. A second entrance is located on the south façade of the rear ell. Windows are 6/6 vinyl replacement windows. A brick end wall chimney is located on the west side of the stone house.

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

Discuss the history of the building. Explain its associations with local (or state) history. Include uses of the building, and the role(s) the owners/occupants played within the community.

According to historic map the stone house at the corner of Bailey Road and Fiske Street near the Andover Town Line was owned c1875 by M Moore. This is possibly Marius Moor[e] (b1814) who resided in Tewksbury. Marius was the son of John and Emily Moore of NH. The Moore family moved to Tewksbury prior to 1846, as their daughter Mary died in Tewksbury in March of that year. It is probable that the family resided in the stone house, although no deeds were found. In 1870 Emily was still residing in Tewksbury with Marius.

By 1889 the house was occupied by WR Dixon. The following year L. Josie Dixon sold the house to Daniel S Wood. According to the property valuations from 1890 the stone house had an associated barn and carriage house on 57 acres. That same year Daniel Wood sold the house, barn, and 23 acres to Charles and Sarah Hood. The house and barn were part of Hood Farm until 1926 when they were sold to George A McCormack Sr. Various members of the McCormack family owned the house until 1945.
